Did you know that a <u>WALKING SCHOOL BUS</u> operates at Brighton Beach Primary School?

The BBPS Walking School Bus is a great way to get to school. It offers kids the opportunity to meet up with friends and neighbours for a safe, fun and friendly walk to school in the morning.

There are many benefits for children (and adults) walking to school – besides the obvious one of the extra exercise! Here are just a few:

- The environmental benefits are enormous both in terms of a substantial reduction in greenhouse gas emissions as well as in developing in the children a keen awareness of environmental issues.
- New friendships are established including those formed across different age groups.
- Children learn that they can EASILY walk up to a couple of kilometres (approx. 20 minutes).
- Each child develops a sense of pride and achievement as their walks go towards earning certificates.
- The WSB is a fun and supportive way to learn basic road safety.
- Children also learn about the neighbourhood and the geography of their local area.
- The WSB route is supervised by volunteers there is a "Driver" at the front; and a "Conductor" at the rear of the WSB group.
- WSB Participants arrive at school full of energy and ready to start the day.
- The WSB always arrives at school on time!

Parents are welcome to become "volunteer walkers" to help supervise; and they are equally welcome to walk behind the WSB to see how it operates and ensure that their child is comfortable. (Strollers are welcome too!) Becoming a "volunteer walker" is a very simple process, and further information about this is available from the Co-ordinator and Registrar.



Parent Information Sheet

Who walks with the children? The Driver and Conductor of the bus are parents just like you, so contact the WSB Coordinator if you are thinking of volunteering.

Does the Walking School Bus™ (WSB) operate in the rain?

The radar will be checked in the morning and you will receive an email if bus is cancelled.

What will happen if my child misbehaves while using the WSB?

If a child misbehaves, WSB volunteers will follow these procedures:

- Initial lack of co-operation (eg. rudeness, not following Driver/Conductor instructions): the volunteer will notify the school so that they can warn the child.
- Second misdemeanour: the child is to walk with the Driver and the Driver should notify the school to send a note home.
- Third misdemeanour: the child is to be excluded for a day from the program. Parents will be notified beforehand.

In the event of continuing lack of co-operation: the child is permanently excluded from program. Parents will be notified beforehand.

*In the event of any major misbehaviour, steps 1 to 3 will be bypassed and the child will be unable to participate in the future, parents will be informed. Major misbehaviour includes running onto a road ahead of the driver, physically assaulting another child or adult, any behaviour that endangers anybody's life or safety.

What should I do if my child will no longer be using the WSB?

You need to notify the WSB Co-ordinator.

Is it too late to volunteer with the WSB?

It is never too late! Contact your school's Walking School Bus Co-ordinator to arrange a training session. As a volunteer, you can choose to contribute to the WSB program through activities such as walking with the children, promoting the WSB or even ensuring there are forms in the office. Simply contact the WSB Co-ordinator.

What happens if my child is late?

The morning WSB is a casual service it operates like a bus on wheels. If your child is not at the allocated stop in the morning, the driver will assume you are taking them to school and the WSB will continue on to school without him/her.

This means that:

- 1. It is your responsibility to ensure that your child is on time for the WSB. If your child is late, he/she will miss the bus
- 2. It is your responsibility to wait with your child until the WSB arrives. If you choose to leave your child to wait unattended at the WSB stop and your child is not there when the WSB arrives, the volunteers will have no way of knowing that your child was waiting for the WSB and will not report your child's absence.

Unforeseen circumstances

In the event of any unforseen circumstances, you will be alerted by SMS up to 10 minutes prior to the bus' scheduled start time, so please ensure that your contact details are kept up to date.
